

Former President of Pakistan, Pervez Musharraf Addresses US-Pakistan Relations, the Future of Pakistan, and His New Party at a Fundraising Dinner in Atlanta

October 25, 2011 (ATLANTA, GA) – Former President of Pakistan, Pervez Musharraf attended a fundraising event hosted by the All Pakistan Muslim League's Atlanta Chapter on October 21, 2011. The event was organized by Dr. Farhat Haseeb, Chair of APML's Atlanta Chapter, and took place at the residence of Nouman and Diana Rashid, members of the Atlanta Chapter of APML.

The sold-out event was attended by **former Governor Sonny Purdue** and his wife, along with several prominent American-Pakistanis from the Atlanta area, and from Washington DC and Philadelphia. Among the attendees were Dr. Raza Bukhari of Philadelphia and Mr. Adeel Shah, President APML-US.

President Pervez Musharraf gave the keynote address, speaking in depth on the history of the US-Pakistan relationship, its current declining state due to the current regime in Pakistan, and how the relationship may be salvaged. He also spoke on the APML party agenda. President Musharraf made a note about the lack of political participation in Pakistan which allows the status quo to exist. He encouraged the American Pakistani community to help educate their counterparts in Pakistan on their political rights, to encourage a high voter turnout in the upcoming elections.
